Follow the instructions below.

- 1. Navigate to the following location-
C:\Windows\System32\drivers\etc. and copy the old 'hosts' file somewhere safe (just in case).**
- 2. Copy the attached 'hosts.txt' file into the proper folder (C:\Windows\System32\drivers\etc) and make sure you rename it to 'hosts' instead of 'hosts.txt'.**
- 3. Then reboot your machine.**
- 4. Open up the TOPO! Explorer application.**

Below is the hosts.txt file Carl received.
